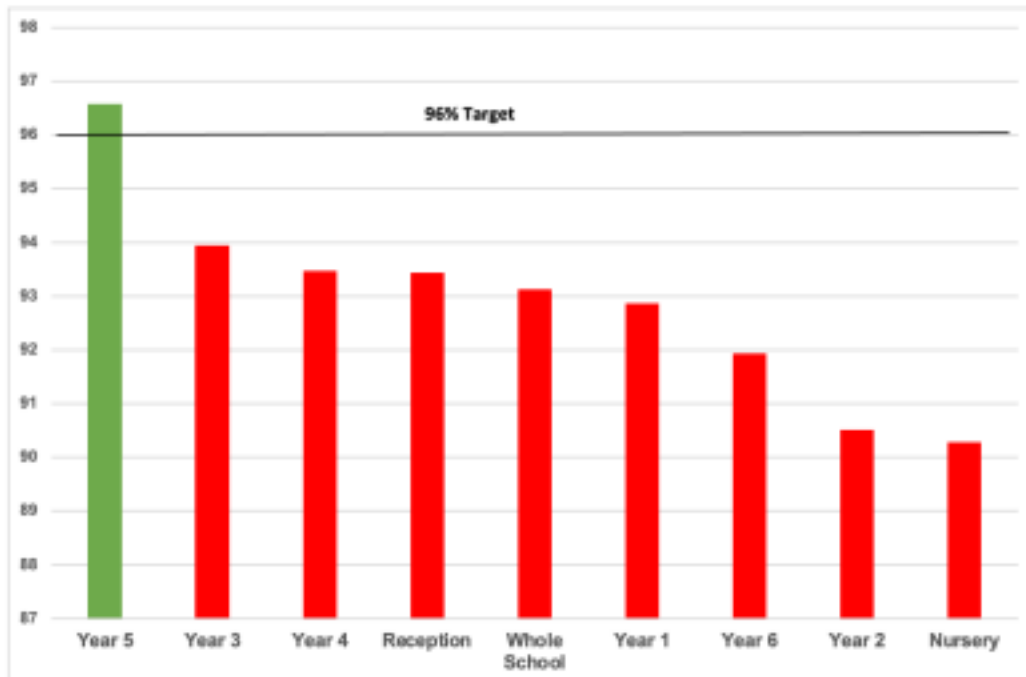
Parents - we need your help!

This term, our Year 4 pupils have been learning about inspirational figures and honing their biographical writing skills. One of the key figures they focused on is Malala Yousafzai, a courageous advocate for girls' education. Malala, originally from Pakistan, survived a life-threatening attack by the Taliban at the age of 15 due to her activism. Despite this, she continued to champion the right to education for all girls, earning her the Nobel Peace Prize in 2014.

Our pupils have been deeply inspired by Malala's story. They have shown a clear understanding of the purpose of their writing and have produced excellent work. Through their biographical projects, they have not only developed their writing skills but also gained valuable insights into the impact one person can have on the world.
