

Curriculum Miss Casey, Deputy Head

To help promote a love of Reading across Griffin Primary School, we are launching The Reading Road Map program. The Reading Road Map is a reading initiative that we are using in Years 3-6. Our main aim is to allow children to discover a wide variety of new and exciting book titles and authors, as well as creating and nurturing a love for reading.

Children will be given their own map, which lists the 60 different texts they can read throughout the year. The theme encourages children to find new books that they might enjoy, and possibly new genres they have never tried or encountered before. Once a child has read a book, they can get it ticked off on their checklist. For every certain number of books read, the children will be given a certificate. While it would be fantastic for children to read as many books as they can, the aim is to encourage them to enjoy reading and finding new books they want to read.

The books in each year group are spread across a range of reading abilities and as children become stronger readers over the course of the year, they will be able to access more books on the list. The books are colour coded to reflect challenge. Each phase 3/4 and 5/6 have 60 books to share between classes. Children will be bringing their book home as part of their home reading. Books that are damaged or lost must be replaced or compensated for.
