We have a busy half-term ahead of us before Easter. World Book Day on March 7th will be a little different this year with all children having the opportunity to watch a live lesson from the BBC where pupils can meet with several authors and explore the writing process. In addition, pupils will take part in a range of activities to promote a love of reading and will have the opportunity to dress up as their favourite book character. We look forward to seeing the exciting costumes!

Our whole school PSHE theme this half-term is 'Healthy Me'. Healthy Me covers two areas of health: Emotional health (relaxation, feeling safe, friendships, mental health skills, body image, relationships with food, managing stress) and Physical health (eating a balanced diet, physical activity, rest and relaxation, keeping clean, safety, first aid). Throughout the school, children will be learning how to care for themselves and we encourage these conversations to continue at home.
